



The numeral cancels of the Netherlands; their frequency of usage on the early issues and auction prices realized (part 3 of 4)

Parts 1 and 2 covered the introduction, a listing of all 259 numeral cancels with their specifics, and a detailed listing of all numerals found on the first issue, as well as their auction prices realized. In part 3 we cover in detail the numerals found on the second (1864) issue.

But first I would like to pass on some new information that has come to light earlier this year (1997). This information has resulted in some changes and additions to the listings in the previous article (ASNP Journal Vol. 21/4).

Please make the following changes:

Page 71 under "57's Hertogenbosch..." change the "1" in columns 5 and 7 to "2".

„ Delete: "67 Leeuwarden..." (This is the one added to 's Hertogenbosch; the "5" was mistaken for a "6").

„ Delete "100 Steenbergen...", and "101 Steenwijk...". They both turned out to be false.

„ under "107 Utrecht...", add "1 cvr" in column 5, and change "+1W" to "+1W +1 cvr".

Page 72 Add a "*" to Sliedrecht

„ Change "Total per 4-15-97" line to: "Total per 6-9-97 67 cps. 90 cps 39 cps. 13 cps 142 cps."

„ Change "Totals now:" line to:
"Totals now: 70 cps. 92 cps. 40 cps. 13 cps
158 ex.

„ Change date on last line from "April 4" to "June 6".

„ Roughly middle of the page, right side column:
Change "April 15" to "June 6"

Page 74 First line. Change "Haarlem" to "Haarlemmermeer".

Page 75 Top of page: Delete the line "101 Steenwijk...".

Page 76 Add the information under "67 Leeuwarden..." to "57 Den Bosch....".

„ Change "73 Maastricht..." to " *1 73 Maastricht" and add: " *1 73 Maastricht 10/2 pl.5/- Die 564 97 3599 klfo luxe ex. 2100.-"

„ The information under "cover 91 ,," should be changed to "107 Utrecht..", and moved between "105,," and " *1 132 Zierikzee...".

„ Under " *2 135Rie. 367" add:
*2 135 5/1 -. Leopardi
90e 1997 916 foto links kort fl 260.-

P.S. This points out that a large auction house is very important to bring high prices, since this same item brought fl. 925 in 1996 at Rietdijk.

Page 77 Under listing of "Other catalogs used..", add:
van Dieten B.V. 1932 thru 1939, cat #248-271.
Also all after 1945 (#307)

„ Change "Rietdijk..." (since 1967) to "Rietdijk..." (since 1928)".

Also, to illustrate how I determine which cancels are duplicates, refer to the example of # 91 Rotterdam. These illustrations came from different catalogs in different years, but without any doubt, they refer to the same stamp/cancel.

Now on to the new material:

Numerical cancels on the 1864 (second) issue

The stamps of the second issue could be used for postage till November 1879. Since the numerical cancels were used from April 1869 through June 1893 one can find numerical cancels on stamps of this issue.

Numerical cancels on the 2nd issue point to a late usage of the stamps, since they were replaced by the 3rd issue in 1867, and should be considered curiosities, with prices based solely on what somebody is willing to pay for it ("liefhebbersprijs"). Numerical cancels on the 15 cent orange (1864 issue) are relatively the most common.

Cley in his "Emissie 1864" writes the following: To get an overview of the usage of the numerical cancel on the second issue I have added all the copies I've found in my own collection, collections of others, as well as the ones mentioned in auction catalogs over tens of years. This has resulted in the following:

5 cent:	40 copies
10 cent:	63 copies
15 cent:	124 copies
Total:	227 copies

Nov 1, 1879

Although some duplicate stamp counts are probable, I don't think this influences the overall conclusion that the rarity of the cancels is inverse proportional to the nominal value of the stamp (e.g. numerals on the 5 cent issue are three times as rare as on the 15 cent value).

It is obvious, based on the issue date of the numerals (4-1-1869 (april 1, 1869)), that as far as the 5 and 10 cent issues are concerned, we mainly are dealing with 'expired' stamps, stamps that might have sat in a box or drawer for a couple of years, prior to their actual usage.

Relatively speaking the 15 cent value is the most common one. This becomes clear if we realize that the 15 cent value was available at the post offices for a much longer time than the two lower values. The 15 cent 3rd issue wasn't sold until all the 15 cent 2nd issue stamps were sold out. The time between the availability of this issue and the release of the numeral cancel is fairly short. It is even likely that at the time of the release of the numeral cancel (April 1, 1869) there still were 15 cent 2nd issue stamps available at some of the smaller postoffices. An example is Alphen, for which twenty two 15 cent stamps with the numeral '3' are known. Although the numeral is more common on this higher value stamp, this is offset by the higher value of the stamp itself.

It is also understandable that numerals of the large post offices (5 (Amsterdam), 44 ('s Gravenhage), 91 (Rotterdam), 107 (Utrecht)) are relatively common on all values of the 1864 issue. Based on the registered totals it is not the 10 cent, as was to be expected, but the 5 cent value which is the rarest.

Nearly all known numeral cancels on the 2nd issue are for numbers 1 through 135, the first set issued (Alkmaar

through Zwolle). In theory all numerals issued prior to 11-1-79 (January 11, 1879) (the date the 2nd issue lost its validity) can be found on the stamps of the 2nd issue. These are numerals 1 through 138, 141, and 151 through 196. Known also are 10 cent stamps with a numeral 44 in both red and black; use of wrong color ink, corrected to black.

An 'oddball' I saw is a 10 cent stamp with both a light FRANCO cancel as well as a numeral "5". Most likely this stamp was used twice.

On entires with stamps of the 2nd issue, numeral cancels are very scarce. Only a few covers are known to exist, among them:

To get an idea about the numbers of numerals on the stamps of the second issue, I have listed all copies brought to auctions since 1928 (v. Dieten B.V.). From this we notice that during the last few years quite a few new numbers were discovered. Compare it to Mr. Cleij's list.

To get a good overview I photographed cancels from the auction catalogs in order to identify duplicate stamps/can-

cles being offered in subsequent auctions. The duplicates are identified with an * in the first column. If only one stamp has multiple entries it is flagged as *1; when a second stamp with the same number also has multiple entries, it is flagged with *2, etc.



Strange Bedfellows

Churchill reportedly once said: "There are no lasting enemies, only lasting interests". This pictorial essay portrays the trials and tribulations of the Europeans (mostly Dutch) interned by the Japanese who, following the latter's capitulation were suddenly thrown into a different yet ominously familiar situation.

Indonesians saw the Japanese surrender as a golden opportunity for long awaited independence. Within days they proclaimed their own sovereign state on August 17, 1945. Large areas, especially on Java and Sumatra, immediately became de facto Republican controlled. Since this made the situation quite uncertain for the internees, the Allied governments, including the Dutch, instructed them by radio to stay in the camps, and not to venture outside.



This Indonesian postal card (JV BK 9 / DN ; JK 10 / APPI) is correspondence between family members, probably from the wife to the husband, both internees in different sections of the same camp. The large round rubber stamp is from the Jogjakarta branch of the P.O.T. (Panitia Oeroesan Tawanan, or Committee for Prisoners Affairs). 

A Japanese Field Postcard recycled for civilian use by imprinting the 5 sen stamp. The Indonesians then recycled it a second time for their own use and propaganda by printing the large, red cachet on the left portraying their red-and-white flag and the slogan "Once free, forever free!" It is unlisted in the DN ("Dai Nippon") catalogue. APPI shows a variant under JK 9D. For good measure some Japanese indicia were blackened out by hand. The poorly stamped black rectangle reads "Repoeblik Indonesia / P.T.T." (Postal, Telegraphic and Telephone Services). It was written in Magelang (central Java) on March 18, 1946, and bears no postal cancels. The addressee lived in the large complex of buildings owned by the Catholic church in (by then Dutch controlled) Djakarta/Batavia.



Special delivery of the "Wounded Soldier" 10 sen postal card (JV BK 14 / DN; JK 16 A / APPI) from the same address as above. The letter was written on October 18, 1946, and mailed from the Indonesian post office in Djakarta 10 days later. Although Dutch post offices also functioned in that city, the sender preferred the Indonesian, since the card was for a woman in Indonesian held territory.



A (lighter) color variant of the preceding postal card (many are known), written in Djokjakarta on September 30, 1946, and through the mediation of the Central Office of the Indonesian Red Cross Society (round rubber stamp) carried to Djakarta, where it was mailed from the Republican post office on November 21, 1946 to Holland. This was the only postal card written in English, all others in this article were in Indonesian. A Dutch letter would have probably been returned or confiscated. Note that Ned. Indie was crossed out and replaced by Indonesia.




A good example of mutually exclusive political (and by extension, philatelic) control, this Republican postal card (JV BK 10 / DN; JK 11 / APPI) was first mailed from Pekalongan (central Java) on January 8, 1947 and intended for Dutch held Soerabaja (east Java). It was intentionally detoured via Djakarta, very likely received by the Indonesian post office in that town, and delivered to the addressee locally. Honoring the request of the sender, he then proceeded to affix (U.S. printed) Netherlands Indies stamps prepaying the postcard rate of 3 1/2 c, and mailed it from the Dutch post office (Australian type Batavia - Centrum cancel of January 13, 1947) to Soerabaja, where the arrival cancel was placed on January 16. This is the only example in this article not from or for Europeans/Dutch.

Finally, the cover that started it all. I owe Theo Van Dam (Anaheim, CA) for bringing this to my attention. It still contains the long letter written to her American friend by a Dutch woman in Republican held Bandoeng (west Java) on October 31, 1945. She described the unrest in that city, having her house surrounded by some 100 armed Indonesians, who then searched it for Japanese. She mentioned the 7 Japanese soldiers and their officer armed with tommy guns, who protected her ("...first they are our enemies, and now they are our friends, fighting for us, and fighting good for us."), and also gave her food and clothing. The envelope received a U.S. Navy cancel of November 20, and was backstamped San Bernardino, CA, December 13. The letter was probably smuggled out of Bandoeng to Allied-held territory. However, U.S. Navy cancels of this period are only known for several points in west New Guinea. This letter obviously did not have to make it that far, and must have been handed to a visiting U.S. naval vessel in the nearest port, most likely Djakarta/Batavia. By what means, and why it was accepted for further transportation, with no stamps attached, and no postage due levied, will probably forever remain a mystery. Or, can anybody send unfranked letters to a U.S. postal inspector?

decided to make a statement by reference to the Constitution. The Finance Minister considered that the cancellation of the freedom of postage would be revoked, except for members of the Royal House and the P.T.I. The secretary of the General Board of the Dutch Reformed Church consulted the Finance Minister about this, who gave a detailed reply in a letter dated December 22, 1928. I do not think you will be surprised to learn that the revocation (of the freedom of postage) is contrary to regulations in the Constitution. However, the increase in expenditures of the Church treasury resulting from this it has been decided that the freedom of postage for the Church and its postal places, by the therefore mentioned institutions and government powers, will be increased in the budget of the Government.

Contrary to what one is used to with respect to 'temporary regulations', the temporary regulation for churches has been proven to be indeed temporary. As of January 1, 1994 all church mail has to be franked normally. This is the end of a regulation that, starting January 1, 1894, had given churches the special right of postage free mailing. In this article we will review this right.

The high cost of mailing

The problem of the high cost of mailing that many individuals, companies and institutions have to contend with, is not something recent. Already at the end of the 18th century several institutions tried to obtain the right of postage free mailing from the postal service.

When the Postal regulations of 1807 became effective several matters were put in order. Clause 5 of these regulations states, "No freedom or reduction of postage will be allowed except in the case of packages or letters addressed to Municipal Councils or Magistrates, with the seal or cachet of the Constitutional Authorities of the Kingdom affixed to them. For these only the single postage rate will be paid without consideration of weight. This exemption does not extend to letters addressed to Members of other Organizations or Ministers of the Diplomatic corps, even if the required seal or cachet is affixed on these letters or packages."

Special status

The churches, who would have liked to be included in clause 5 of the postal regulations, were this time left holding an empty bag. However, after the restoration of Independence in 1813 the situation seemed to have changed in their favor. The Constitution of 1815 mentioned the special position the Dutch Reformed Church would hold. Clauses 136 through 138 indicate the obligation of the federal government to ensure that the church would be financially secure.

Royal Decree

One of the results was that the postage free right would also be granted to the Dutch Reformed Church. On May 26, 1816, The Postmaster-General, Van Pallandt Van Keppel, presented a draft of a Royal Decree to King Willem I, that would lay the foundation for the churches' freedom of postage. This happened at the request of the Governor-General of Education, Arts and Sciences, Repelaer van Driel, who was temporarily responsible for the


affairs of the Reformed Church, etc. Repelaer van Driel had received several requests for freedom of postage from the Chief Rabbinate of the Israelites, the Walloon Committee, the Reformed Classical Church(?) and Provincial Government.

Other churches are also included

On June 24, 1816 he could announce that the draft had been approved by the king. From this time a church freedom of postage would be in force for a large number of church authorities and colleges belonging to the Reformed Church, the Wallonian Church, the Remonstrant Brotherhood and the Jewish religion. (Later on similar decrees would follow for the Lutheran Church (1819), the Baptists (1825), the Roman Catholic Church (1830) and the Restored Evangelical Lutheran Church (1836). (The Calvinistic Church (Gereformeerde Kerk) never had postal freedom). A schedule was formulated that showed exactly who was allowed freedom of postage and to what extend. Among other things, the churches had to content with the following restrictions:

- letters could never be deposited in a mail-box but they had to be presented at the postoffice.
- anyone who was entitled to use this right, except the Director-General and his legal council, had to put a wrapper around the letters and ensure that the name of the sender and his function were clearly marked on each letter. All letters sent to Boards and qualified persons had to be counter signed.
- under no circumstances was private material allowed to be included in the letters.

If there was any doubt with respect to the last restriction, the postal authorities were allowed to open the envelope



and, if there was an infringement, charge for postage due. In addition, a warrant would be issued as this was considered fraud.

Discussion

Over the years the churches' freedom of postage was debated regularly. The (lower) Chamber held a debate in 1870 on new postal regulations. It was unclear whether the churches' freedom of postage should be maintained. The Cabinet wanted to abolish the various freedoms of postage as they were concerned about the cost. The Finance Minister made reference to the situation in England where, "the misuse that is made of these freedoms of postage has come to a point that one has decided that even official Governmental mail has to be franked". On the other hand it was his opinion that, in view of the important position held by the church congregations in the Netherlands, it was unacceptable to deprive "those congregations from the freedom of postage that they have enjoyed since 1815". He indicated furthermore that, in his opinion, the churches were entitled to freedom of postage under the constitution, even if this was not spelled out implicitly. "I submit that when, after 1815, the calculations were made for the costs required to manage the church congregations, the then existing freedom of postage was probably taken into accounted". Eventually, with a 30 to 1 vote, it was decided that the churches would keep their freedom of postage.

Revoked

During 1891, 1907, 1914 and 191? changes were made to the postal regulations, however, during the parliamentary debates the churches' freedom of postage was not discussed. The Minister of Public Works, who had the responsibility for the postal services, wrote in a letter, dated March 27, 1920, to the other ministers that, with some exceptions, freedom of postage was going to be abolished. In fact only the freedom of postage for the Royal House, the PTT and "for the time being: the so-called churches' freedom of postage, in anticipation of the eventual revision of the financial relations between the Government and the church congregations" would be maintained. The Minister wondered if the freedom of postage for the churches were to be abolished the government would have to reimburse the churches in view of the previously mentioned clause in the constitution.

It would take years before it became clear how to revoke the freedom of postage. At one particular instant it was even considered to allow the churches the use of official service (dienst) stamps, which was rejected by the House. Finally a decision was made that, starting January 1, 1924 all freedom of postage would be revoked, except for members of the Royal House and the PTT. The secretary of the General Synod of the Dutch Reformed Church inquired by the Finance Minister about this, who gave a detailed reply in a letter dated December 22, 1923, "I do not share your opinion that the revocation (of the freedom of postage) is contrary to regulations in the Constitution. However, to meet the increase in expenditures of the Church congregations arising from this, it has been decided that the cost of mailing Church related postal pieces, by the therefore qualified institutions and governing boards, will be included in the budget of my Department. (...) Complete freedom for all

mail from the Synod, its secretary and treasurer would be contrary to the intention of the now established regulation". In other words, from now on there would be a restricted freedom of postage and it would also no longer be called that way.

Church mail would, from now on, be mailed as official mail of the Department of Finance. Every year the churches would be asked to report the number of postal pieces that were mailed. The PTT would receive a compensation depending on these figures. A summary for 1955, the last year that these returns regarding the number of mailings had to be made, looks as follows:

This sum came to approximately .4% of the total compensation paid by the government (Departments) to the PTT during 1955. This was determined based upon the statements from the churches and a statistical average, determined by the PTT, of all governmental mail. This compensation increased quite rapidly over the years. In 1963 Fl. 46,000.00 was paid to the PTT which however still amounted to the same previously quoted .4%.

Royal Commission

Towards the end of the sixties, an increasing number of voices were raised to abolish all existing freedoms of postage. The Royal Commission on Public Worship, also known as the Van Warren Commission, reported in 1967, when a revision was discussed of the 1815 clause of the Constitution, several points of view regarding the churches' freedom of postage. It was concluded that the question of freedom of postage was so closely tied to that constitutional clause, that it could not be solved that simply. If a general compensation to the churches would be awarded, based upon the size of the membership, then the freedom of postage could be abolished. If not, then the freedom of postage could only be abolished if the churches were compensated. The government was of the opinion, based upon a statement by Finance Minister Witteveen, that a 'buy out' should be made which would cost about 1.5 million guilders.

New law

It would take many more years before everything was settled. The law of December 7, 1983 contained a financial settlement where the government would make a one-time payment in favor of the churches' retirement funds. The new law to terminate the financial relation between Church and State took effect on July 1, 1984. But, on January 1st of that year, service(official) mail had been abolished. As the mail from the churches fell into this category, a special emergency law was required to allow the churches to still use this

until July 1st of that year. The old service envelopes were stamped with "Tijdelijke frankeerregeling kerken" ("Temporary mail regulation for the churches"). During this time negotiations took place to establish a definitive regulation regarding franking. Eventually a transition regulation came into effect valid until January 1, 1994. This meant that, until that date, the churches could still send their mail postage free. The regulation was valid only for in-country mail and for pieces not requiring special services such as express and/or registered mail. A cancel "Tijdelijke frankeerregeling Kerken" had to be put on the postal pieces as well as the name of the sending authority complete with address, postal-code and place of residence.


The end

As of January 1, 1994 all church mail is franked normally. The diocese of Roermond has purchased a cancellation machine; at other places one uses stamps. Because of the costs involved, the diocese of Haarlem for instance has urged their employees, in writing, to limit the amount of mail to be sent out. Some Parishes have been requested to establish a central mailing address, in order to be able to handle outgoing mail as economically as possible.
